Thank you for considering the enrollment of your child(ren) in South Bay Christian Academy. S.B.C.A. is an integral and inseparable part of South Bay Pentecostal Church of Chula Vista, and was formed and now functions for the primary purpose of training the Christian young people of South Bay Pentecostal Church to live for God for time and eternity, as opposed to seeking youth from outside homes, or purposing to reform presently wayward youth. No "unchurched" young people will be considered without a letter of recommendation from their pastor.

All faculty members are required to be faithful members of this church, or one whose doctrinal and holiness standards are in harmony with this church. They must be fully trained in the AOP and/or ABEKA required training, depending on their area of labor.

S.B.C.A. accommodates K - 12^{th} grades, running a 4-day school week, 8:00-3:30 daily. Sessions are Monday through Thursday.

Kindergarten – Grade 12 = \$5,000.00 per year

* 10% Discount available if paid all at once.

ENROLLMENT FEE: =\$150.00 per child (Re-enrollment = \$80/child)

CURRICULUM:

Kindergarten – Grade 3 = \$350.00 per year Grades 4 – 12 = \$450.00 per year TECHNOLOGY FEE (Grades 4 – 12): = \$300.00 per year

BILLING:

All accounts are billed on the 20th and are due on the 1st of the following month. The first payment is due Aug. 1st, and the last payment is due May 1st. All delinquent accounts (those not paid by the 5th), will be charged a **LATE CHARGE of \$50.00**. An account that remains delinquent on the 15th (2 weeks past due) will force the suspension of those students on the offending account, until it is brought up to date.

There will be a \$25 fee for each NSF item, plus bank fees.

BOYS:

-Pants Navy, Gray or Khaki twill pants (plain, straight leg style) must be purchased at the above

mentioned uniform shops.

-Shirts: JR & SR. HIGH: Long sleeve Oxford dress shirt with school logo, for Chapel days or special

events.

Long or short sleeved polo shirt, with school logo for non-chapel days.

KINDERGARTEN THROUGH ELEMENTARY: Same, but may be either long or short sleeved dress shirt. Polo: long or short sleeved shirts with school logo for non-chapel days.

Dress shirts must be worn on Chapel days with school tie.

-Belt: Solid black, or navy blue.

-Shoes: Solid black (including sole), or navy blue: Dress or Casual type; dress boots are ok.

Canvas and cloth styled shoes are acceptable.

If in doubt, check with school office.

-Socks: <u>Solid</u> black, navy blue, white or white w/stripes are ok. (Must be at least

2" inches above the ankle) No sport type socks.

-Ties: <u>Solid</u> navy blue. Must be purchased at the above-mentioned uniform shops.

NO EXCEPTIONS!

-Sweater/Jacket: **See Footnote.

BOYS' P.E. UNIFORM:

Applies only to Elementary through Secondary. There is no P.E. uniform requirement for Kindergarten & Primary grades.

-Pants: Solid navy blue sweat pants. Must be new for the 2020-2021 school year.

-Shirt: Red & White 3/4 sleeve T-shirt. Item may be purchased at **STORES ON P.2**, or:

The current cost for the shirt around \$20.00, includes school lettering, student's last name, and

number. The lettering must be Royal Blue ONLY. BE SURE IT DOESN'T FIT TOO TIGHTLY.

-Socks: White Athletic or white w/stripe: red, blue or red/blue combination.

-Shoes: Tennis; Solid white, solid navy, solid black, or a white/navy or black

combination.

-Sweatshirt: Red or Blue with school logo. This is not a mandatory item, but is optional.

GIRLS:

KINDERGARTEN THROUGH ELEMENTARY

-Jumpers: Jumpers are to be purchased from the above-mentioned uniform shops. They must be at least 2"

inches below the bottom of the knee, at all times.

-Blouses: Long or short sleeved, Peter Pan or Oxford collar and have school logo. Must be purchased at

the uniform shop listed.

-Socks/

Leotards: Solid navy & white, NO OTHER COLORS!

Socks must be at least 2" inches above the ankle.

-Shoes: Solid black (including sole), navy blue or white, closed heel and toe. Boots

are ok. No rivets, studs, etc...plain boots only. No cloth or jelly type shoes.

GIRLS:

JR. & SR. HIGH

-Skirts: Skirts must be purchased from **STORES** listed on **P. 2**.

ALL SKIRTS MUST BE AT LEAST 2" INCHES BELOW THE BOTTOM OF THE

KNEES, AT ALL TIMES! (THIS INCLUDES WHEN SITTING)

Items should be ordered by July 20th to insure delivery before the start of school.

-Blouses: Long-sleeved, Peter Pan or Oxford collar dress shirt with school logo. Also, white 3/4 sleeve twill

blouse. Plaid skirt is only to be worn with white blouse. All blouses must be purchased from

Choice Uniforms or Educational Outfitters.

-Hosiery: Stockings may be used by Sr. High <u>only</u>. Options are sheer neutral, solid

navy or solid white. NO LEG WARMERS OR LEOTARDS.

-Socks: Solid navy or white. NO OTHER COLORS

Must be at least 2" inches above the ankle.

-Shoes: Solid black (including sole), navy blue, or white, with closed heel and toe. Boots

are ok. No rivets, studs, etc...plain boots only. No cloth or jelly type shoes.

GIRLS P.E. UNIFORM:

Applies only to Elementary through Secondary. There is no P.E. uniform requirement for Kindergarten & Primary classes.

-Culottes: Navy Blue. Must be purchased from Choice Uniforms or Educational Outfitters and must be at

least 2"inches below the bottom of the knees, at all times.

-Shirts: Red & White long sleeved T-shirts. Same as Boys, see Boys' requirements.

(PLEASE, BE CAREFUL THAT YOUR SHIRT IS NOT TIGHT.)

-Shoes: Same as Boys' P.E. requirements.

-Socks: Same as Boys' P.E. requirements.

-Sweatshirts: Same as Boys' Optional P.E. requirements.

SWEATER/CARDIGANS/JACKETS

For **ALL STUDENTS**, K-12th grade:

Navy Blue or Red Cardigans.

Navy Blue or Red V-neck pull-over, or vest.

Navy Hooded Microfiber Jacket

All items must be purchased through our uniform providers.

**NOTE CONCERNING SWEATERS/JACKETS: An outer covering is not mandatory; however, if an outer garment is to be worn, it must be S.B.C.A. Uniform. Other outer coverings will be allowed on campus, but not in the Learning Centers or in Chapel. Only the S.B.C.A. Uniform Garment can be worn in the Learning Centers and in Chapel. Please, don't let it get cold on your student without having secured their APPROVED GARMENT.

***PLEASE NOTE: UNIFORMS THAT ARE TOO OLD OR FADED WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR SCHOOL USE. ALSO, UNIFORMS SHOULD FIT PROPERLY (NOT TOO BIG OR TOO SMALL).

Students will not be admitted unless an immunization record is presented and immunizations are upto-date.*
